ABOUT HEAT

The heat in chile peppers comes from the compound capsaicin. So thank the capsaicin molecules on our wings for your burn, sweat, and tears of joy!

HOW HEAT IS MEASURED

Heat is measured in Scoville units (SHU). In 1912, Wilbur Scoville came up with the heat measurement by grinding up chiles, diluting different quantities in sugar water, feeding people the dilutions, and testing their reactions. One part capsaicin per million sugar water rates 15 SHU.

Our **Mad Dash** sauce is over 6,000 SHU! The new **Final Dash** heats up to over 60,000 SHU, but we didn't stop there! Our newest sauce, **After Dash** scorches in at over 150,000 SHU. This means that 150,000 parts of sugar water are required to dilute one part **After Dash** before its heat is no longer felt. **After Dash** is not for the weak at heart; in fact, we require a waiver for this one.

FIRST AID
